9th Annual WINTER CLASSIC Development Stream Tournament

- The DS level was introduced by the OWHA in 2011. Development Stream (DS) is a subset of the House League Program, offering a tryout-based, enhanced opportunity for House League players who are a) looking for a development bridge to competitive hockey or b) do not wish to make the commitment, in time or cost, to competitive hockey, but are seeking more competition and skill development that is afforded by house league alone.

New Business?



2020/21 SEASON

- The upcoming season will not look like a traditional hockey season
- Orangeville Girls Hockey Association (OGHA) must follow protocols put in place by the Ontario Women's Hockey Association (OWHA), the Town of Orangeville and the Public Health Unit
- The season will consist of 2 Blocks. Block 1 will run from September 9th – December 31st. Block 2 will run from January 1st – End of season (approximately end of March)
- All players will receive pictures and a year end trophy. We are hoping to hold a year end banquet

2020/21 SEASON

BLOCK 1 – HOUSE LEAGUE

- **Grading Skates** – ALL players must attend ALL grading skates to be placed on a team. See our website for schedule. Fundamentals will start Mid-October
- **Minimum 2 Week Development** – ALL teams will practice for a minimum of 2 weeks following team selection
- **Modified Game Play** – With OWHA approval and a date to be determined, Teams will be playing either 3 on 3 or 4 on 4 depending on age, with modified rules. OWHA will release modified game play rules soon.
- **Modified Game Play with Extended Groups** – With OWHA approval and a date to be determined, Teams will play modified games against other organizations (ie: Caledon, Brampton, Vaughan)



2020/21 SEASON

BLOCK 1 – REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS

- **THERE ARE NO TRYOUTS**
- Players from 2019/20 Rep teams will automatically be invited to skate with 2020/21 teams
- House League players wishing to be considered for a Rep team this season should **check the box when registering**, stating they would like to be considered for a Rep team. If there is a spot on a team, a Rep coach may reach out
- **Minimum 2 Week Development** – ALL teams will practice for a minimum of 2 weeks following team selection
- **Modified Game Play** – With OWHA approval and a date to be determined, Teams will be playing either 3 on 3 or 4 on 4 depending on age, with modified rules. OWHA will release modified game play rules soon.



2020/21 SEASON

BLOCK 1 – REPRESENTATIVE TEAMS

- **Modified Game Play with Extended Groups** – With OWHA approval and a date to be determined, Teams will play modified games against other organizations

BLOCK 2 – HOUSE LEAGUE & REPRESENTATIVE

- OGHA will reassess the OWHA guidelines and determine if the season will continue with modified game play or not

There will be NO tournaments, league play, playoffs, provincials or Day of Champs at this time



2020/21 SEASON

ANTICIPATED SCHEDULE – HOUSE LEAGUE

- Fundamentals – Saturday mornings
- U7 & U8 – Saturday and every other Tuesday
- U9 – U15 – Wednesday, Saturday and/or Sunday
- U20 – Monday
- Ladies Rec – Friday

*Note, ice times may change dependant on ice availability



2020/21 SEASON

PROTOCOLS – ALL PLAYERS

***All Protocols can be found on our website**

- Players/Goalies can only play for one organization. Cannot play on a boys and girls team this year
- Players/Goalies cannot play for an OWHA team and a private team (ie: private 3 on 3 league)
- Players/Goalies can only play on 1 team
- No call up players
- Players must not share water bottles. Bring your own tissues and a bag to put them in and take home
- Players/Goalies must keep physical distancing and not touch each other



2020/21 SEASON

PROTOCOLS – ALL PLAYERS

- Coaches cannot touch players or help them up
- Masks must be worn inside of the arena at all times when not on the ice
- All staff, parents and players **must** fill in the online screening form before coming to the arena
- All staff, parents and players **must** provide their name and contact information upon entering the arena

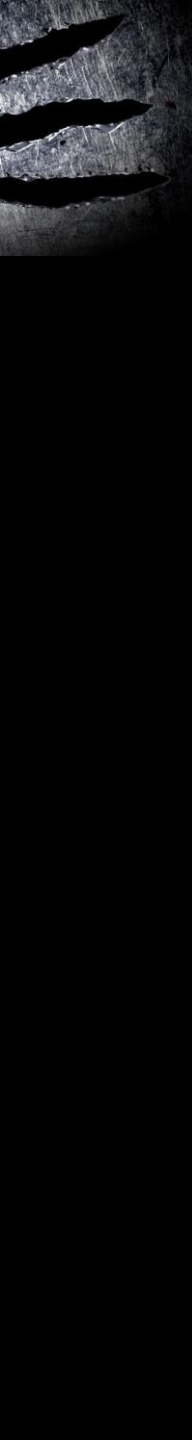
